

Vagueness and indeterminacy are thought to infect many of our most important metaphysical tools: existence, composition, persistence, parthood, essence, and identity, to name a few. I argue that several sorts of indeterminacy afflict the causal relation. If, as it is plausible to hold, there is a relationship between causation and moral responsibility, then the indeterminacy that infects the causal relation will also infect the metaphysics of moral responsibility in interesting ways.
